#### Results

- 5 in Totnes, 1 in Brixton
- In Totnes
  - 600 attendees
  - 22 enterprises pitched, 19 still going
  - Approx. £80,000 raised in form of debt and grant
  - Approx. £15,000 in non-financial 'investments'
  - 350 investments, 120 investors
  - Approx. 15 new jobs
  - Costs = approx. £1200/event + plus activist/'volunteer' time





#### Our criteria

- enterprise is ethical, sustainable and appropriately local
- demonstrates competence through business plan and/or track record
- business model does not rely on donations or grant funding
- 'investment' required would allow venture to 'get to the next level' –
   investment could be financial and/or non-financial.
- ideally would operate in one or more of the sectors identified in the Local Economic Blueprint – food, renewable energy, housing, health & care
- contributes to the long-term resilience of the community
- one slot is reserved for a youth-led enterprise.

  - Key sectors (Local Economic Blueprint)
  - Import substitution survey (Berkshares)
  - Mapping networks allies, catalysts, influencers, supporters
  - Mapping 'new enterprise' ecosystem
  - Mapping assets land, buildings, skills
- Engage and build support
  - Develop collaborative relationships
  - Visioning and awareness raising events
  - Build networks coffees, socials, pubs
  - Communications email newsletters, social media










#### 'Transition Oriented Enterprise'
